Dear Fellow APCR Members,

There is much I could have, should have, would have done, but I hope we can focus on where we are now. AUR will look different this year as will our APCR sessions, meetings, and networking; but the spirit remains the same- we are a group of engaged professionals eager to learn from each other and support each other. While none of us knows what subsequent years will bring, I am confident that this spirit will continue!
