Fellow APCR Members,

Hello and welcome to you all. We have just completed another residency recruitment season, with anxious, eager applicants applying to our programs and our faculty wanting to interview the cream of the crop. I wish all of your programs success in the Match! We have had a few personnel changes this year. Last fall, Christine Dragosljvich left Radiology as well as the APCR, the Membership Committee Chairman position, and the APCR Board. Mary Ellen Hobler agreed to take over the chairmanship of the Membership Committee. This month Jennifer Apfel resigned upon receiving a promotion at her institution.
